OBJECTIVES AND INVESTMENT POLICY

The sub-fund, expressed in Euro, aims to provide a positive return, measured in Euro, defined as a mix of income and capital growth, by providing dynamic exposure to a diversified range of asset classes. The sub-fund will seek to achieve its investment objective by investing in a global flexible diversified portfolio which may include: equities, fixed-interest and floating rate securities, non-investment grade securities, currencies and cash. Depending on market conditions the allocation of the sub-fund's portfolio in the above mentioned asset classes may be flexible but always within the investment limits as described below. The sub-fund will invest in securities issued by corporations, other non-government issuers, governments and government related issuers located in both developed and emerging markets and denominated in global currencies. The sub-fund will not have any restrictions in selecting securities in terms of industry or geographical allocation.

The sub-fund may invest:

- Up to 100% of its net assets in fixed interest and floating rate securities;
- up to 70% of its net assets in equities instruments, including depositary receipts (such as American depositary receipts "ADRs", European depositary receipts "EDRs" and global depositary receipts "GDRs");
- up to 35% of its net asset value in government bonds, corporate bonds (investment grade and non-investment grade) and equity instruments issued by entities located in emerging markets;
- up to 20% of its net assets in non-investment grade instruments (including non-investment grade debt securities issued by emerging market issuers);
- up to 10% of its net assets in China A-Shares via the Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect program and debt securities issued by Mainland China issuers through Bond Connect program;
- up to 20% (cumulatively) in asset backed securities ("ABS"), mortgage backed securities ("MBS") and collateralized loan

obligations ("CLOs");

- up to 10% of its net asset value in contingent convertible securities ("CoCos");
- up to 30% of its net assets in units/shares of UCITS and/or other UCIs, including ETFs, which provide exposure to the above mentioned asset classes;
- up to 10% of its net assets in exchange traded commodities ("ETC");
- up to 50% of its net assets in money market instruments.

The Sub-fund will invest without limitation in securities denominated in currencies other than the reference currency (EUR). The sub-fund may use strategies to hedge developed market currency risks, in relation to currencies different from the EURO. In aggregate, and accounting for active currency positions as described in the previous paragraph, the non-EURO currency exposure will not exceed 70% of the Sub-fund's net assets.

The sub-fund will not invest in distressed securities nor in default securities.

The sub-fund may use financial derivative instruments for the purpose of investment and risk hedging. The Sub-Fund will enter into total return swaps. The Sub-Fund will not enter in repurchase or reverse repurchase agreements.

The Sub-Fund is actively managed. The Sub-Fund is not managed in reference to a benchmark.

The Sub-fund is suitable for investors who search long term investments. The investor must be able to accept a certain volatility and the possibility of losing part of the invested amount.

The Sub-Fund has three Unit-Classes: Class R1, S1 and T.

R1 and T are capitalization Share-Classes. For Share-Class S1, the net incomes of the Sub-Fund will be distributed in accordance with the Prospectus of the Fund.

You may request to redeem the units held at any moment, by sending a request on any business day.

THE SYNTHETIC RISK AND REWARD INDICATOR DOES NOT ADEQUATELY CAPTURE THE FOLLOWING RISKS:

- **Credit risk:** The Sub-Fund invests in securities whose credit rating may get worse, increasing the risk that the issuer is unable to fulfil its commitments with a negative impact on the securities' price.
- **Developing market risk:** The Sub-Fund is exposed to securities highly sensitive to political and economic instability of developing countries such as civil conflicts, changes in government policies and in taxation, currency fluctuations and other developments in the laws and regulations of countries in which investments may be made. Price changes may be higher than those in the markets of developed countries.

- **China Risk:** Investing in the People's Republic of China (PRC) is subject to the risks of investing in emerging markets and additional risks, which are specific to the PRC market. In case of investment in China A shares and/or in debt securities issued by Mainland China issuers, where securities are held in custody on a cross-border basis, there are specific legal/beneficial ownership risks linked to compulsory requirements of the local central securities depositories.
- **Coco risk:** investments in CoCos may expose the Sub-Fund to different risks, the main ones being: Conversion risk, Write down, Coupon Cancellation, Call extension risk, Capital structure inversion risk, Industry concentration risk (as described in the Prospectus).
- **Regulatory risk:** Risk that regulation changes (in particular in respect of securitizations and contingent convertible bonds) may negatively impact the Sub-Fund in respect of market prices and liquidity.
- **Derivative risk:** in order to achieve its objectives, the Sub-Fund may use derivative instruments whose value may be subject to price fluctuations, positive or negative, much larger than those of the securities in the same Sub-Fund.

CHARGES

These fees and charges are used to pay the costs of running the Sub-Fund, including the costs of marketing and selling. They reduce the potential growth of your investment.

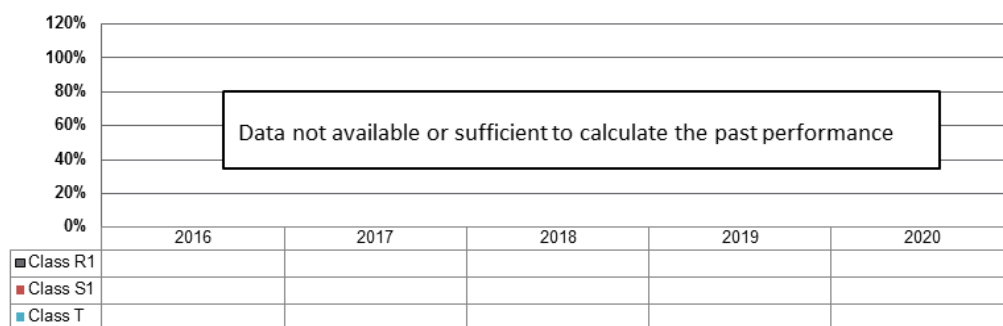

The **ongoing charges** figure is based on an estimation. This figure may vary from year to year.
